





LiveStock Worrying

Sheep on your countryside walks are pregnant and will give birth in the Spring. Help them stay safe by keeping dogs on a lead.

- * Livestock worrying is a criminal offence and comes under the <u>Dogs</u> (<u>Protection of Livestock</u>) Act 1953. It comes with a maximum fine of £1000.
- * 'Worrying' is where a dog attacks or chases livestock causing injury or suffering.
- * This isn't just a threat to a farmer or land owner's livelihood, it's also a dangerous situation for the animals involved, and could lead to more risk if the animals get onto the road.
- * A farmer is allowed to kill the dog if it's worrying their livestock.

Always keep your dog under control around other animals and if you see a dog on the loose worrying animals, report it.
