

These will be presented back at a public meeting in due course.

Despite the rather unseasonal weather the children in Froxfield school are engaging in their usual summer activities and events, including traditional Maypole dancing by the children in Key stage 1, the children all danced beautifully and delighted their proud parents with this charming annual event.

Another annual tradition for children in reception is the Forest School sessions led by staff from Chichester Forest Schools. The children thoroughly enjoy spending time in the woods, tackling physical challenges, including tree climbing, and lighting fires. The school is very grateful to Love's Charity for funding these sessions. It's so good to think that Love's Charity which was set up in Froxfield Green over 100 years ago still contributes to the education of our village children.

I am looking forward to joining years 5 and 6 for a day during their residential visit to the Minstead study centre - I'm not sure quite what I'll be doing there but I've been told to bring my walking boots!

The summer term is when the school is involved in a wide range of interschool sporting events. Mrs Burchett took nine girls to the football tournament in East Meon before half term and she said, 'I couldn't have been prouder of them. Their communication, resilience and team spirit was absolutely amazing and they thoroughly deserved to win. Well done girls!' I happened to be in school when the winning team returned with the biggest trophy I've ever seen - certainly a very impressive win.

Two days before I wrote this piece, I welcomed Kate Fay from The English Speaking Board to undertake the assessment for the children in my 'Speaking with Confidence' club.

Each child was assessed undertaking three activities: giving a three minute talk on a subject of their interest, reciting a poem of their choice and reading from a novel. The children gave talks on a wide and very interesting range of topics: Lambing; Children's Book Illustration; Puppy Breeding; SCUBA diving; Playing the Piano; Singing in Winchester Junior Choir, Playing Football in the Local League and Women's Football. The children worked extremely hard to prepare for the assessments and I was very proud of how they conducted themselves throughout, managing understandable nerves and all performing so well - a credit to themselves and the school. We are awaiting the results but I'm sure everyone will have done well.

Spiritual Garden has been completed, Chris Pike - a school parent and a Garden Sculptor has designed, made and installed a very beautiful, bespoke, curved wooden bench. The space looks amazing, and the children are enjoying spending time in the garden - mesmerised by the water feature. Huge thanks to Chis Pike for his design and creation.

All the school is getting ready for Sports Day - from sprinting practice for the older children to practising skipping in the preschool - everyone takes part in Sports Day - it's a wonderful opportunity for the children to develop resilience, perseverance and camaraderie as they try their best in all the events and support their fellow team mates.

Of course July marks the last month of the school year and with it the end of their time in Pre school for our smallest children and the end of Primary school for the children in year 6. The teachers ensure that the children throughout the school are well prepared for the transition they will make in September either moving up a year into a new classroom or taking a bigger step of starting BIG school or secondary school.

I am especially looking forward to attending the Leavers' Service in Portsmouth Cathedral - it's a splendid, joyous and moving occasion - a fitting way to send these young folk out into their secondary schools with Bishop Jonathan's prayers to sustain them.
